*Meet Bharini, a young orphan boy in Chennai born with leprosy. With no prospects, Bharini would have been left to live a life of destitution—but Children's Home of Hope (CHOH) altered the course of his life forever. Fast forward several years: Bharini becomes a supervisor for a factory and lives in his home with his pregnant wife. Unfortunately, Bharini's suffering is not over—Zarine is involved in a fatal scooter accident, and Bharini is forced to watch his wife die in front of his eyes.*

*Forced to grapple with pain and hardship once again, Bharini, who was the first orphan of CHOH, decides that the best outcome of his situation is to give back. Reminded of the charity he received as a child, Bharini finds light in his circumstance and is inspired to turn his home into an orphanage. As of today, he has taken in seven children aged 1 through 18 and welcomes these local orphans with the same love and compassion he received at CHOH.*

*One orphan, 11-year-old Jai Kumar, lost his father to cancer at the age of 8. Not long after, his mother developed breast cancer and was hospitalized. While his mother was coping with cancer, Jai Kumar was left with no one to look after him. His days were spent in the hospital looking after his mother; he had nowhere else to go. Within two years of his father's death, Jai Kumar's mother passed away. When Jai Kumar was first admitted to Bharini's orphanage, he was withdrawn and malnourished. Thanks to the charity of Bharini, Jai Kumar has had the opportunity to heal and recover. Today he is social, active, and able to excel in his studies.*

*The story of Bharini—and Jai Kumar—highlights the power of giving. One act of kindness today results in another act of kindness tomorrow. In this way, we leave our mark on the world. With every passing day, Bharini feels incredibly grateful and humbled by these orphan children. He is continually hopeful and optimistic of his ability to use the opportunities made possible to him by CHOH as a means to spur positive change.*

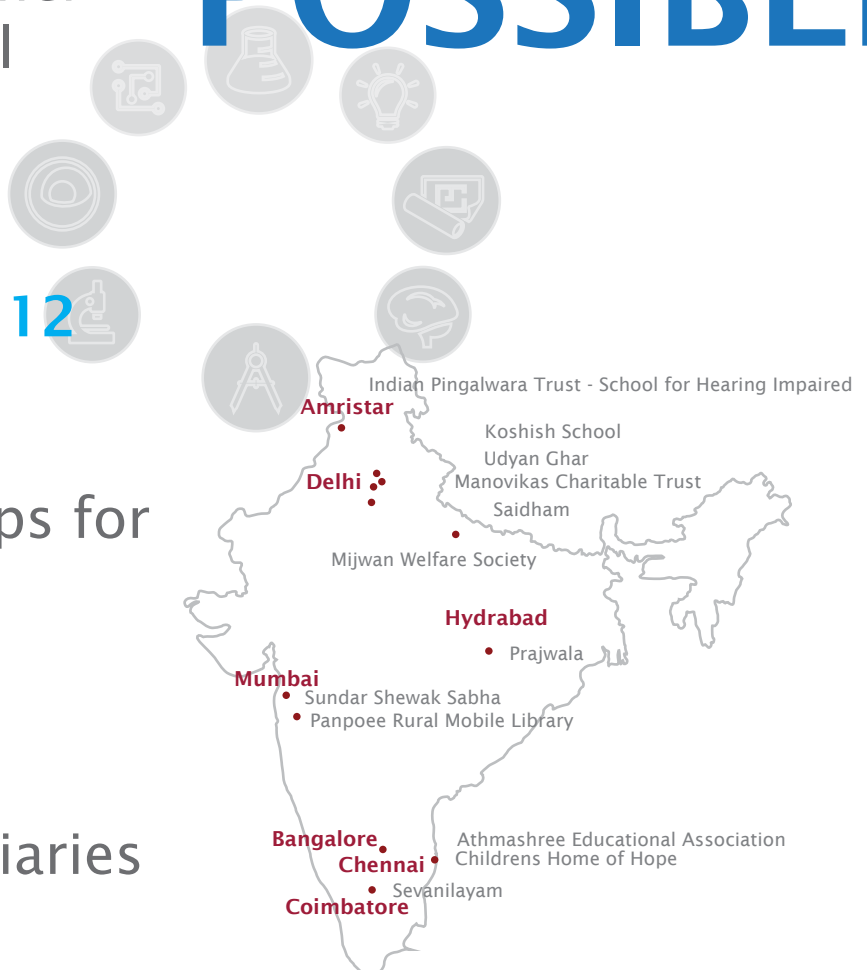
