Home of Hope is not just a charity; it is a symbol of active hope for children who deserve an education and for communities fighting for a brighter future. It is a reminder that we are all connected in the tapestry of humanity and that our collective actions can uplift and transform lives.

I want to take a moment to acknowledge and applaud the incredible work of the dedicated individuals who are the backbone of Home of Hope. The volunteers, board members, and supporters who give their time, their resources, and their hearts to make our mission a reality. Your unwavering dedication reminds us that when we come together, we can overcome even the most daunting challenges.

Collectively, we have achieved extraordinary academic milestones.

In academics, all of the students at Koshish passed their 10th class exams with 1st Division. 40 students were admitted to professional courses.

All the students at CHOH have passed their exams and many graduates have been placed at Apollo Hospital or with private international companies. Many others have enrolled in further education courses such as accounting, computer courses, nursing, etc.

All of the students at Saidham passed their 10th and 12th grade exams. The Saidham academy that HOH launched and funded last year also had many kids do well in the JEE exams. One of those students, Sandeep, was admitted to IIT. A great achievement within the first year of the academy.

Many of the students of Abhyudaya Ashram in Gwalior continue their education and excel in their English Speeches after the classes held through the MEET Program. One of those students, Ajeet Chhari, was placed as a government officer after scoring well and acing his interview.



With Home of Hope, fostering growth beyond academics also carries profound impact.

11 kids of the Kaifi Azmi Sports academy participated in the Open National Tae Kwan Do Championship 2023 held in Mathura UP. 7 won gold medals and 4 silver medals under the leadership of Coach Yodha. This academy is founded and continuously sponsored and developed by Home of Hope.

We are also beyond excited to announce that HOH has Partnered with the non-profit LunaARC to send the digital artwork of our Home of Hope kids and volunteers to the Moon. The first collaborative effort of digital artwork from diverse communities on earth has been submitted and the Mission is planned to fly on Firefly's Blue Ghost lunar lander. It is scheduled to launch on a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket and land on the lunar surface in May 2024.

This year we have received a generous donation of \$250K from HOH long time supporter JPSethi and Renu Sethi to build a Skill center in the Himalayan district of PAURI, in the state of Uttarkhand. This skill center will prevent distress migration and alter the course of their future, while enhancing the livelihoods of its numerous neighboring villages.

HOH partnered with "Siruthuli" to plant 30,000 tress, thanks to a generous donation of \$50 K from an anonymous donor, creating a "lung" space in the City of Coimbatore. HOH can proudly call itself a climate warrior to help create a better world.

Each and every one of our other projects is doing exceedingly well and we invite you to visit our website to learn more about them.

We have offered a helping hand, but, as we all know, the work is far from over.

Thank you for your unwavering support of Home of Hope, and may the spirit of generosity continue to shine brightly in the lives of those we touch. The Skill Development Centers of Greater Noida and Pauri focus on uplifting unreached members of society by providing quality short-term courses with positive long-term impact. These courses are pocket friendly and have little to no minimum requirements for admission, thereby making them accessible to as many individuals as possible. Our courses are for those who have potential skills which are practical and creative in nature – the variety of courses available are Stitching, Beauty Therapy, Jewellery Making, Graphic Design, and Computing Skills (Hindi/English Typing).

Built a badminton court, started Taekwondo and Yoga sessions in the location. Established alliance with National level sports academy.

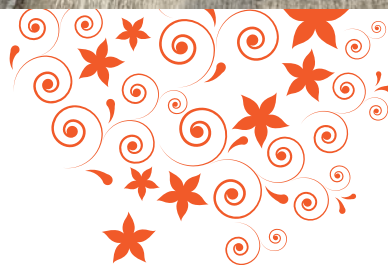
